Parents, this may be a great way to teach your children about vocations to the priesthood and religious life.


For those who think the Lord may be calling them, it could be a good place to start for further discernment.

Why Elijah?

In the Old Testament (I Kings 17), the prophet Elijah invites himself into the home of a poor widow and her son, and imposes upon their hospitality. A great drought is upon the land and the widow has only enough food for one last meal. But the presence of the prophet brings about miraculous providence so that their staples of flour and oil never run out. Thus, Elijah is a blessing to the home, and the widow and her son survive because of his presence. • Similarly, we as Catholics might imagine that there is a drought of vocations, and that we shall all soon have to do without the Eucharist, because there are no priests. But the Lord does call men to be priests, even today. He wants to provide for us. Therefore, in the Elijah Cup ministry, we pray to the Lord for an increase in priestly and religious vocations, and to ask that those called will have the courage to respond. Our prayers, then, affirm God's providence. • Each week, a family, couple, or individual will receive the Elijah Cup at the end of one of the Masses. For that week, the Elijah Cup will remain with them as a focal point of prayer in their homes, the prayers dedicated specifically for an increase in priestly and religious vocations. At the end of the week, they will return the Elijah Cup before Mass starts. The Cup may then be handed over to the next person or family. • When your family prays around the Elijah Cup, remember the Eucharist that sustains us, and that God's providence is great, and that He has not forgotten us or left us without priests.
