

Confession Schedule

It is impossible to social distance or wipe down surfaces within the confines of a confessional, so we have been doing confessions in the Barn on Fridays (about every other Friday for an hour). We look forward to a time when we can go back to our normal schedule for confession, which really is easier for everyone (including our priest). But at least for the time being, and until such a time as we can return to a regularly scheduled confession time, we propose the following pandemic plan.

- October 2nd (First Friday): Confessions in the Barn from 6:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.
- October 9th (after Mass): Confessions after the 9:30 a.m. daily Mass in the Pastor's Office
- October 16th Confessions in the Barn from 6:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.
- October 23rd Confessions after the 9:30 a.m. daily Mass in the Pastor's Office
- October 30th Confessions in the Barn from 6:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.
- November 6th (First Friday) Confessions after the 9:30 a.m. daily Mass in the Pastor's Office
- November 13th Pastor is away
- November 20th Confessions in the Barn from 6:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.
- November 27th (the Day after Thanksgiving) Pastor is away
- December 2nd Parish Advent Penance Rally planned to start at 7:00 p.m.
- December 4th (First Friday) Confessions after the 9:30 a.m. daily Mass in the Pastor's Office
- Hereafter, we find ourselves in Advent, so we are unable to list times of confessions for December beyond the 4th, as our Pastor's schedule will be determined by the Penance Services of other parishes which are not yet planned.

Adoration

Our Lady of the Mountains parish will have Eucharistic Adoration all day from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 3rd. We will have Benediction at 7:00 p.m. with Deacon Greg reposing our Lord.
